Message Summary: Mark Twain once remarked, "Some people are troubled by the things in the Bible they can't understand. The things that trouble me are the things I can understand." As we study Matthew 5:38-42, it becomes very clear – to **become** a Christian is easy, to **be** a Christian is another matter altogether. How shall we conduct ourselves in a way that will bring the glory of Jesus for the goodness of others?
