Hope Chapel - "2022 Easter Season Series"

Message Summary: Abraham and the near sacrifice of his son Isaac is one of the greatest "symbols" or "types" in all of Scripture. God was actively speaking to Abraham about what will happen 2,500 years later on the same hill later to be called Golgotha. God preached the Gospel message to Abraham (Galatians 3:6-8) long before Jesus' death on Calvary's cross.

God's Preview of Calvary

Genesis 22:1-19

- 1. God spoke in many different ways Hebrews 1:1; Hosea 12:10
 - A. Parable is a "Type" or a comparison of what is yet to come.
- 2. God used "types" and "symbols" to deliver a message about the greatest event in history Genesis 22:1-19
- 3. God preached the Good News to Abraham long before Calvary's Cross Galatians 3:8-9

Types and symbols in Genesis 22:3-6

- Abraham a type of God the Father
- Isaac a type of Jesus
- Mt. Moriah Golgotha
- 3 days Journey Considered his son dead (Heb. 11:19)
- 2 unnamed men Between 2 thieves
- Wood laid on Son's back Jesus carried the cross
- The Father & the Son going up a hill called Golgotha 2,500 years before.
- 4. Abraham said, "My son, God will provide for Himself the Lamb."
 - Genesis 22:8,14
- 5. God said, "In your seed all the nations of the earth shall be blessed." Genesis 22:18
