Hope Chapel - "2022 Easter Season Series"

Message Summary: The crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ offer hope for eternal life for all who believe. As we consider the events just before and after Jesus was raised from the dead, we'll be challenged to make a decision. First glimmer of hope that there was eternal life was when Jesus got up from the grave and conquered His own death. Jesus gives hope to anyone. Will you allow Jesus to give you eternal life?

Resurrection: Before & After Matthew 27:51-53; 28:1-15

1. Pre-Resurrection Disturbances - Matthew 27:51-53

- A. Ceremonial Disturbance: The veil was ripped in two
- B. Seismic Disturbance: The earth quaked, rocks split
- C. Cemetery Disturbance: God selectively raising believers, they are walking around Jerusalem

2. Post -resurrection Responses - Matthew 28:1–15

- A. Some tried to stamp it out; (Claimed the disciples stole the body)
- B. Some wanted to speak it out
- C. Some wanted to check it out

- 3. Why are some people willing to go to great lengths to cover up unpleasant truths?
- 4. What emotions would you be feeling if you were there at the first "Easter morning"?

APPLY IT (15min) – Spend a few minutes meditating on the truth of this passage and the profound truth of what Christ has done for you through the cross and resurrection.
