**Message Summary:** A mother's love for her children is distinctive and irreplaceable. To watch a child suffer is crushing and almost intolerable for any mom. In this touching scene revealed in three verses, we not only see Mary, the mother of Jesus, at the foot of her Son's cross, we also learn how Jesus cared for His mother. Even from His place of extreme suffering, Jesus was thinking of others and His love for Mary is noteworthy for us.

### **Love Mom patiently**

- 1. Jesus walked patiently through life with Mary
- 2. Motherhood is the toughest job in the world

### Love Mom honorably

- "Honor your father and your mother, that your days may be long" (Exodus 20:12)
- 2. One of the Ten Commandments with a promised benefit
