BEGIN IT (5min) – Open Prayer & Praise

OPEN IT (10min) – How do you feel about God treating everyone the <u>same relationally</u> but different when it comes to <u>responsibility</u>? How do you see this in your own experience following Jesus?

EXPLORE IT (60min) - Discussion Questions:

- 1. Discuss the four relational ways God treats everyone the same. What are some of the barriers to experiencing this?
- 2. Discuss the four ways God treats everyone different. How can a lack of understanding in this area become a barrier in our relationship with God?
- 3. What unique responsibility has God entrusted to you? (Marriage parenting school influence money success a ministry)
- 4. Are there any **relational changes** or **responsibility changes** Jesus is prompting you to make?

APPLY IT (15min): Do you understand that your faithfulness in the responsibility God gives you now will be rewarded in eternity later? Will you live this life with an eternal perspective? Explain.
